

Foothill To Retain Two All-Countians

What to do for an encore? That's what Foothill High School coach Ed Bain is wondering today. In his first season as head coach, he guided the Knights to the CIF "AAA" quarter-finals before losing 27-13 to top-ranked Temple City last Friday.

Bain will have to rebuild his Crestview League champions around a couple of All-Orange County juniors, guard Terry Munhall and defensive back Bill Fossatti.

Four all-leaguers will graduate in June, including All-Everything tackle Cory Claeys. The All-Orange County 230-pounder was lineman of the year in the Crestview League.

Claeys and halfback John Hel-

ton shared top-billing at last night's Foothill banquet as lineman and back of the year. Junior Bruce Akins was Foothill's most improved player.

Tackle Bill Shaw and back Paul Cox, like Claeys and Helton all-leaguers, will also graduate in June. So will regulars such as center Gary Lime, quarterback Gary Rossman, fullback Kim Krausse and halfback Jim McClune.

In addition to all-countians Munhall and Fossatti, the 1968 Knights will include returning regulars such as juniors Akins and Brian Colbert and sophomore Craig Grimm.

Graves, Claeys Top All-League

Tackle Cory Claeys and coach Ed Bain from champion Foothill and quarterback Rod Graves from Tustin, Foothill's only conqueror, top The Register's 1967 All-Crestview League team.

Foothill, currently representing the league in the CIF "AAA" playoffs, was honored with six All-Star selections.

Bain, in his first season as a head coach, guided the Knights from nowhere to the championship. For this accomplishment, he was named coach of the year.

Claeys was a 230-pound bulwark in Foothill's line, both offensively and defensively.

Tustin's Graves edged Orange's Dennis Porter and San Clemente's Tim Butler for back of the year. It was with difficulty and reluctance that selectors separated the trio.

Look at their credentials:

Graves — Completed 89 of 174 passes (51.2 per cent) for 1,525

yards and 17 touchdowns. Ran 79 times for 545 yards (6.9 per carry) and seven touchdowns. Total: 2,070 yards and 24 touchdowns, tops in the county.

Porter — Ran 129 times for 867 yards (6.7 per carry) and 11 touchdowns. Caught 16 passes for 319 yards and nine touchdowns. Punted six times for a 47 yard average. Returned 12 punts for 225 yards (18.7). Returned eight kickoffs for 258 yards (32.3). Led county scorers with 120 points.

Butler — Ran 128 times for 870 yards (6.8) and 12 touchdowns. Caught seven passes for 184 yards. Returned 24 punts for 412 yards (17.1) and two touchdowns. Returned 13 kickoffs for 328 yards (25.2).

Foothill's John Helton, the forgotten man in the all-league backfield, has a better average than either Porter or Butler. He has carried 111 times for 762 yards and a 6.9 average.
